## **New Driveway at 9081 Spring Valley Rd**



**Agenda Item #8, Revising Ordinance 300.15, Regulate Stopping, Standing or  
Parking of Vehicles Ordinance**

The only revision to the ordinance is the addition of number 4 in Section II. This is due to vehicles being parked on the edge of the road at 9504 Spring Valley Road which is a sharp corner with little visibility.

## **300.15 Regulate Stopping, Standing or Parking of Vehicles Ordinance**

- I Authority
- II Adoption
- III Penalties
- IV Effective Date

### **SECTION I - AUTHORITY**

The Town Board of the Town of Berry, Dane County, Wisconsin, has the specific authority under Wisconsin Statute 349.13 to adopt this ordinance.

### **SECTION II - ADOPTION**

This ordinance, adopted by a majority of the Town Board with a quorum present and voting and proper notice having been given, provides for the regulation of the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles on town highway in the town as follows:

- A. The stopping, standing or parking of vehicles on the following town highways in the Town of Berry is subject to the following restrictions and limitations:
  - 1. Scherbel Road, both sides adjacent to Festge Park except the parking lot
  - 2. Carya Road, turnaround area for the months of November, December January, February and March
  - 3. Knickmeier Road, turnaround area for the months of November, December, January, February and March
  - 4. Spring Valley Road, from West town line to address number 9486 Spring Valley Road
- B. The Town Chairperson or the Town Highway Superintendent may temporarily designate and post limits on any portion of a town road when necessary to prevent an unsafe special or temporary condition, which are likely to impede traffic or cause an unsafe condition on town roads, in the absence of such special limitations. Such designation and posting shall expire upon the next Town Board meeting, unless extended or made permanent by the Town Board.
- C. The Town Chairperson or the Town Highway Superintendent, shall direct the Town Roadman to place appropriate traffic signs on the above described highways on or before the effective date of this ordinance, or at any location subject to temporary restrictions. Sign placement is governed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and authorized under Wisconsin Statute 84.02(4)(e).

### **SECTION III – PENALTIES**

- A. No person may operate or leave any vehicle on the above-noted highways, or any portion of a highway then subject to a temporary restriction and posting, in violation of the posted restriction on stopping, standing, or parking.
- B. The forfeiture for a first violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be \$25.00.
- C. Pursuant to Wisconsin Statute 345.47, the Town, shall recover as costs of the action under Wisconsin Statutes 814.01 and 814.036, its actual reasonable expert witness and attorneys' fees.

**SECTION IV – EFFECTIVE DATE**

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the day after passage and publication as required by law.

**Agenda Item #9, Extending the Emergency Proclamation**

The original proclamation is attached. Should the Town extend our proclamation?

Dane County will remain under an Emergency Declaration until at least July 15.  
By approving an Emergency Declaration you may be eligible for federal and state assistance, if funds are available and needed.



## Proclamation of State of Emergency

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization designated the 2019 novel Coronavirus outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern; the United States Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a Public Health Emergency for the entire United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to the 2019 novel Coronavirus "COVID-19." COVID-19 is a contagious, and at times fatal, respiratory disease; the worldwide outbreak of COVID-19 and the effects of its extreme risk of person-to-person transmission throughout the United States, significantly affect the lives and health of our people, as well as the economy, and is a disaster that impacts the health, security and safety of the public; and

WHEREAS, on or about March 13, 2020, the State of Wisconsin and the federal government declared a State of Emergency, due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 Pandemic has impacted, or is expected to impact the Town of Berry, Dane County, Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, because of emergency conditions, the Town Board is unable to meet with promptness; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to sections 323.11 and 323.14(4)(b) of the Wisconsin Statutes it is necessary and expedient for the health, safety, welfare and good order of the Town to proclaim that emergency conditions exist; and

WHEREAS, the emergency has caused the Town to extend, commit and potentially exhaust its pertinent available resources; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality requests State assistance and advises the State of Wisconsin of our emergency conditions:

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Sections 323.11 and 323.14(4)(b) of the Wisconsin Statutes, as Town Chairperson, the chief executive officer of the Town of Berry, Dane County, Wisconsin, I hereby proclaim a State of Emergency, and hereby

- Authorize emergency purchases of goods and materials
- Authorize emergency purchases of services
- Authorize emergency costs to the labor force

This Proclamation shall take effect immediately and shall continue in effect until April 20, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. or such earlier time as a quorum of the Berry Town Board convenes and rescinds the Proclamation.

## Agenda Item #10, Resolution Waiving Interest on Property Tax Payment Installments Due on or After April 1, 2020

As you are likely aware, 2019 Wisconsin Act 185 authorized counties to make a couple changes to the administration of the property tax process this year due to COVID-19. Dane County passed a resolution to do the following:

1. Authorize local municipalities within Dane County to pass a blanket Health Emergency Resolution that waives interest and penalty until October 1, 2020 (does NOT change the due dates; ONLY postpones the interest and penalty start date).
  - a. Blanket for due dates after passage of a municipal resolution
  - b. Blanket for all taxpayers NOT delinquent from due dates prior to passage of a municipal resolution
2. Deviates from the standard settlement schedule this year
  - a. August settlement will be settled on August 20 proportionately based upon amounts collected between February 1 and July 31 (similar to January settlement for December collections)
  - b. September settlement will be settled on or before September 20 making all taxing jurisdictions whole (like a normal August settlement)

Please note the following:

1. To postpone interest and penalty for taxpayers in your municipality, your municipality must pass a resolution.
2. Settlement changes regardless of your municipality passing a resolution.
3. This does not change the due date; it only postpones the start of interest and penalty to October 1 if not paid by October 1.
4. This would apply to both real estate and personal property taxes postponed and not delinquent.
5. The grace period would apply to October 1 (payment must be received by October 8 -OR- postmarked on or before October 1).

There are a couple files in the secure section of Access Dane that your Board may want to help them make a decision (only for best guess estimates based on pre-COVID past practice):

1. "SumTxPmtBal-Feb\_2019\_re" has a column identifying the dollar amount postponed after February settlement
2. "August2019EOM-DelinquencyReport" was uploaded this week and shows by tax year what was delinquent in your municipality as-of August 30, 2019 (some had gone delinquent after the first installment)

Lastly, we have a request to help us keep the public properly informed about applicability to them. Please let us know, if at all possible, by June 15 if your municipality is passing a resolution to waive interest and penalty. If after June 15, please let us know when a decision will be made (sooner than later helps everyone).

**RESOLUTION NO. 2020-2**

Town of Berry, Dane County, Wisconsin

Waiving Interest on Property Tax Payment Installments Due on or After April 1, 2020

**WHEREAS**, in December, 2019, a novel strain of coronavirus known as COVID-19 was detected, and COVID-19 has continued to spread throughout the world, including to the United States and the State of Wisconsin ("COVID-19 Pandemic"); and

**WHEREAS**, because of the COVID-19 Pandemic, on March 24, 2020, Secretary-designee Andrea Palm of the Wisconsin Department of Health Services issued Emergency Order #12, Safer at Home Order ("Safer at Home Order") requiring that everyone in Wisconsin stay at their home or place of residence except in limited circumstances until April 24, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 16, 2020, Secretary-designee Palm extended the Safer at Home Order, with certain modifications, to May 26, 2020, pursuant to Emergency Order #28; and

**WHEREAS**, the federal, state, local and individual responses to the COVID-19 Pandemic and the uncertainty as to the effectiveness of those responses in mitigating the duration of the COVID-19 Pandemic have created economic hardship and uncertainty in the local business community, households throughout the community, and for every property taxpayer in the Town of Berry; and

**WHEREAS**, in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, on April 15, 2020, the Wisconsin Legislature enacted 2019 Wisconsin Act 185 ("Act 185"), which Governor Evers signed on April 16, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, Dane County Resolution 2020 ("The County Resolution") enables, for purposes of Section 105(25) of Act 185, any taxation district in the County to waive interest and penalties on installment payments of property taxes due and payable after April 1, 2020, in a manner consistent with Act 185; and

**WHEREAS**, the plain language of Section 105(25) of Act 185 allows for either a general or a "case-by-case" finding of hardship to qualify for the above referenced waiver of interest and penalties; and

**WHEREAS**, The County Resolution authorizes the waiver of interest and penalties for all property taxpayers in the county on a finding of general hardship based upon current and anticipated economic conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, this Resolution is intended to be "similar" to The County Resolution for purposes of Section 105(25) of Act 185; and

**WHEREAS**, the interest rate on delinquent general property taxes, special charges, special assessments, and special taxes included in the tax roll for collection is 1.0% per month or fraction of a month pursuant to Wisconsin Statute § 74.47(1).

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that pursuant to Section 105(25) of Act 185, the Town Board hereby finds and authorizes the following:

1. Because of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the various federal laws and regulations implemented as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the various emergency orders and regulations implemented by state and local governments, and Act 185, the Town Board finds that all property taxpayers are experiencing hardship as that term is used in Section 105(25) of Act 185.
2. The Town of Berry waives the interest that would otherwise accrue on late property tax installments due and payable after April 1, 2020 as provided in Section 105(25) of Act 185 and enabled by The County Resolution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that all actions heretofore taken by the Board and other appropriate public officers and agents of the Town of Berry with respect to the matters contemplated under this Resolution are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.
