The Village of Cross Plains is concerned that "IF" Stone Valley Road was ever to be extended, the Lot configuration we had proposed would be in the way of that extension. They asked that I lay out the extension line (33' off center) that would impact Lot 1 and I had suggested just leaving it as an easement for future road way, but they requested it to be an Outlot so it was separate from Lot 1. We do not want to leave the Outlot off the CSM because the existing driveway and easement is now currently within this CSM and would resolve any overlapping issues for the Maier's remaining land. This Outlot is an unbuildable parcel that would be held onto by either the Maier's or whoever ends up owning the farm in the future.

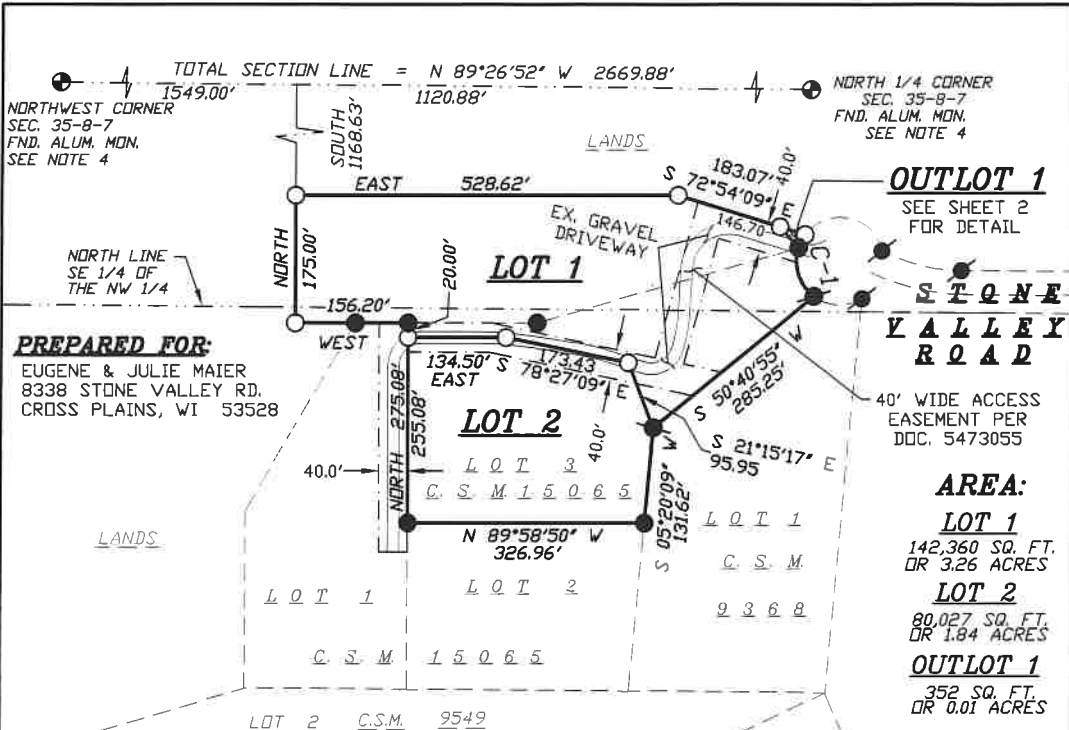

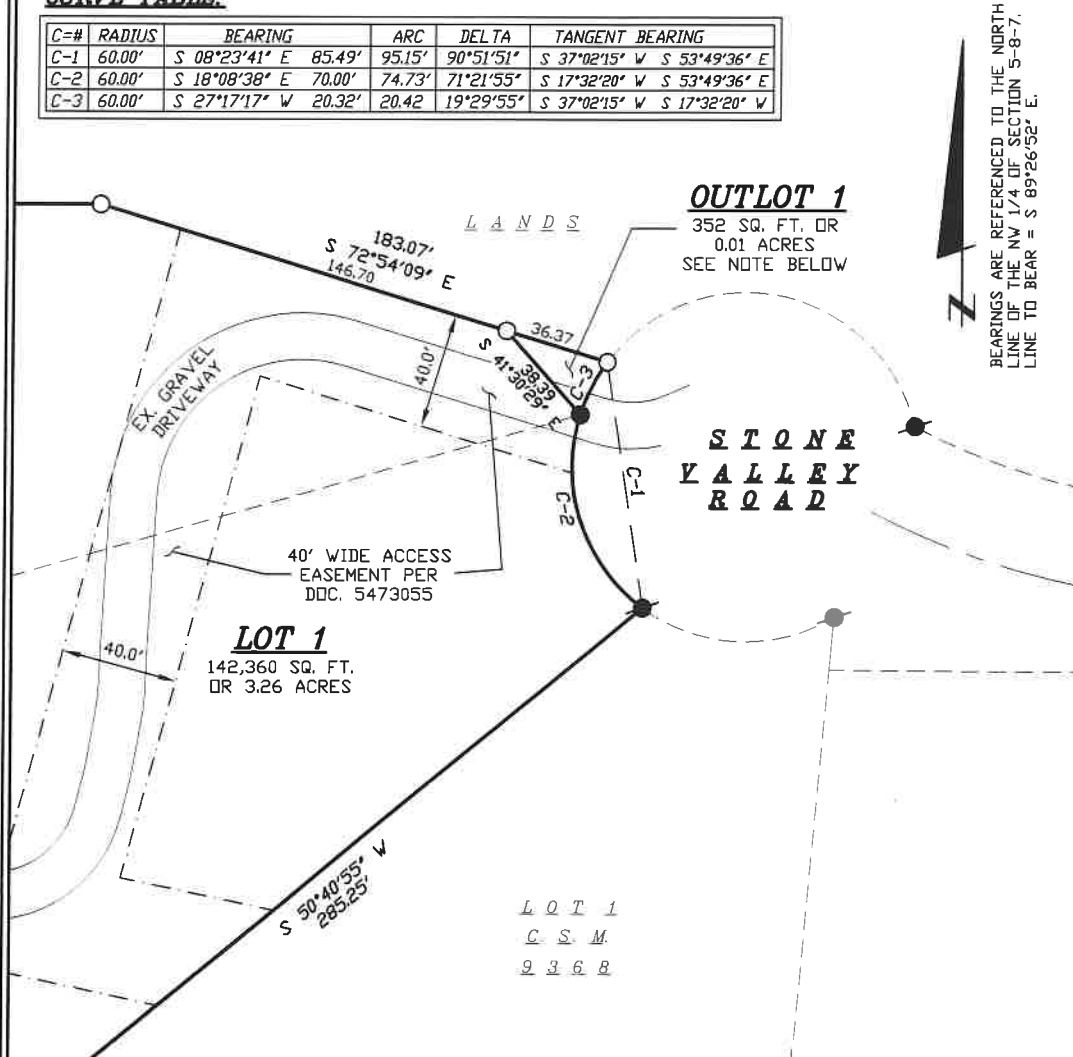

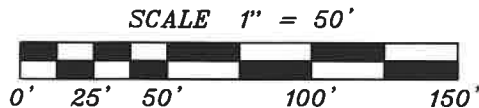

**SECTION II – TOWN BOARD AND PLAN COMMISSION SHALL OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING HOLIDAYS**

## **110.1 Code of Ethics Ordinance**

- II Purpose
- III Adoption of State Standards by Reference
- IV Additional Standards of Conduct

- VII Effective Date

### **SECTION I – AUTHORITY**

Applicable sections, but not limited to, Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 19.

### **SECTION II – PURPOSE**

To establish a code of ethics governing the Town Board, Town Clerk, and promulgated Commissions of the Town of Berry.

### **SECTION III – ADOPTION OF STATE STANDARDS BY REFERENCE**

The Town Board, Town Clerk, and promulgated Commissions of the Town of Berry are to abide by the standards prescribed in Wisconsin Statute 19.59. Any subsequent amendments to the Statute shall be considered automatically adopted by this ordinance.

### **SECTION IV – ADDITIONAL STANDARDS OF CONDUCT**

The Town Board, Town Clerk, and promulgated Commissions of the Town of Berry are to abide by the following additional standards of conduct:

- A. Any individual, before taking action on any matter before them must disclose any financial involvement in a matter that meets any of the following criteria:
  - 1. They have had any financial involvement with the matter within the past year exceeding \$5,000.
  - 2. They have had any financial involvement with the matter within the past five years exceeding \$25,000.
  - 3. They can reasonably expect their action on a matter to lead to an additional financial benefit of \$5,000 within the following year.
  - 4. They can reasonably expect their action on a matter to lead to an additional financial benefit of \$25,000 within the following five years.
  - 5. Any financial involvement in a matter where the individual would reasonably believe disclosure of financial involvement will maintain the faith of the electorate that the governance of the Town of Berry is being administered in a fair manner best reflecting the interests of the residents of the Town.
- B. Disclosures of financial involvement for agenda items shall be made prior to taking action on an item and shall be included in the public record alongside any materials or accompanying attachments to an agenda for a meeting.
- C. Disclosures of financial involvement for matters not appearing on an agenda, the individual shall make public a statement of financial involvement at least 15 days before taking action on an item.

- D. The Town Clerk is authorized under this ordinance to create a standardized form for disclosures of financial involvement to be utilized by the Town Board, Town Clerk, and promulgated Commissions.
- E. All individuals shall conduct themselves in a manner that, to the best of their ability, will maintain the faith of the electorate that the governance of the Town of Berry is being administered in a fair manner best reflecting the interests of the residents of the Town.

**SECTION V – VIOLATIONS**

- A. Violations of this ordinance shall be sufficient grounds for a resolution of censure against an individual.
- B. Resolutions of censure may prescribe a forfeiture of at least \$100, but no more than \$1,000 for individuals who receive compensation for their commission.
- C. Resolutions of censure may prescribe a forfeiture of at least \$10, but no more than \$100 for individuals who do not receive compensation for their commission.
- D. Resolutions of censure must be passed by unanimous consent of the Town Board. If the violator is a member of the Town Board, they are barred from taking action on the resolution of censure, and the resolution must be passed by unanimous consent of the remaining members of the Board.

**SECTION VI – SEVERABILITY**

If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

**SECTION VII – EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the day after passage and publication as required by law.


